DESCENDANTS of AGNES LANGHORN and THOMAS STANDEN:

*Agnes was the 2nd child of Eleanor Taylor & John Langhorn

1801 Nov **THOMAS STANDEN** was born in Lancaster. His occupation: Butcher.

1801 Jan **AGNES LANGHORN** was born at Dalston, Cumb.

(No marriage was found; it is believed they were married in Catholic Church in Lancaster)

Note: Thomas Standen was Roman Catholic. Agnes was probably converted after her marriage as their first 2 children were christened in the Anglican Church. It appears that the family remained staunch Catholic.

No 2 1829 Aug son **THOMAS PARKIN** born Lancaster.

No 3 1832 Apr son James born Lancaster. 1868 Jul died ae 36 a CATHOLIC PRIEST.

Family found in 1851, 1861 and 1871 census. at Lancaster.

1850 Jun mother, Agnes Standen died ae 49 at Lancaster.

1877 Mar father, Thomas Standen, died ae 76 at Lancaster.

AGNES LANGHORN, a sister to Mary Langhorn, was born at Dalston, Cumberland, where her grandparents were living. She was born only 19 days following her father's death in Yorkshire. The mother, Eleanor, and two daughters later moved to Lancaster where Agnes and Mary were raised by their stepfather, Leonard Miller. This is a record of Agnes' family to 1900 with historical information gleaned from research of the family and the history of England. The names in family units that are bold and capitalized are those children who married from each family.

Agnes (age 24 or 25) married Thomas Standen. Since no marriage was found in St. Mary at Lancaster where Thomas lived, we assume they were married in the Catholic Church whose record is unavailable.

Their first three children were christened in the Church of England at St. Mary. After that, Agnes was probably converted to Catholicism as the rest of their eight children were baptized in the Catholic Church at St. Peter in Lancaster.

Thomas was a butcher by trade. The job of the butcher was to slaughter, dress and sell meat for market.

The third child, James, became a Catholic priest and was assigned to St. Peter in Lancaster. He had the privilege of performing the marriages for his younger brother, William, and youngest sister, Mary Jane. James died at the age of 36 in Lancaster

Their daughter, Agnes, died at age 13. The other seven children grew to maturity. Sarah, number five, did not marry. At age 44 she was living with her youngest sister, Mary Jane, in West Derby near Liverpool.

The mother, Agnes, died in June of 1850 at the age of 49 when her youngest child was five years old. Thomas and his younger children lived with his eldest daughter, Ellen Dawson, and her family for over 20 years until his death in 1877 at age 76.

Family found in 1851, 1861, 1871, 1881 and 1891 Census at Lancaster.

ELLEN STANDEN, the eldest child, married Daniel Dawson in September of 1849 at St. Peter in Lancaster. They lived in Lancaster where Daniel worked as a house carpenter and joiner. They were the parents of nine children. Only one died as a child, John Daniel. No marriage was found for daughters, Sarah and Mary Ann. Sarah became a teacher and Mary Ann a dressmaker.

From a letter dated June 30, 1884, written by Leonard John Nuttall: "To son Leonard 42 Islington Liverpool. . . . should you go to Lancaster call on my cousin, Mrs. Ellen Standing Dawson, who keeps a butcher shop in Church Street who will kindly receive you." The Nuttall records for Standen was Standing.

From the Richard Nuttall diary: with Leonard John Nuttall, "Saturday May 16, 1885....afterward visiting Mrs. Ellen Dawson over the river from Lancaster in Skerton."

THOMAS DAWSON, married Elizabeth Richardson at St. Thomas (Catholic Church) in Claughton. They lived in Lancaster and were the parents of seven children. Thomas was a butcher and innkeeper. The family were found in the 1881 and the 1891 census at Lancaster

WILLIAM DAWSON, married Jane Rigby at St. Peter (Catholic Church) in Lancaster. William's occupation was joiner. They were the parents of four children. The mother, Jane, died at age 43, leaving her youngest child at age 6. The family were found in the 1881 and 1891 census for Lancaster. By 1891 William was a widower and his daughter, Elizabeth was the housekeeper Also living with them was William's mother in law, Catherine Kennedy age 63.

Father, John Goulding died before 1891.

AGNES STANDEN DAWSON, (age 30), married John Goulding (age 36) at St. Peter (Catholic Church) in Lancaster. John was a laborer. Three children were born to this couple. The father, John, died by 1891 leaving Agnes with three children ages 6, 4 and 1. In the 1891 census Agnes was working as a fish hawker to make a living. Agnes remarried May of 1893 to John Parkinson.

JAMES DAWSON, married Fanny Blake at the Register Office in Lancaster. The occupation of James was butcher and Fanny a domestic servant at the time of their marriage. No children were found for this couple.

#9 1893 Nov **ELLEN DAWSON** ae 24 md. **JOHN ATKINSON** ae 27 at Lancaster. Occupation of John: Foreman at Wagon Works.

ELLEN DAWSON, married John Atkinson in St. Peter (Catholic Church) at Lancaster. He was a foreman at the wagon works. Since this couple were married so near to 1900 no search was made for any children.

THOMAS PARKIN STANDEN, married Mary Gardner in May of 1851 at the Roman Catholic Chapel in Lancaster. Thomas' occupation was house painter and Mary's a servant at the time of their marriage. They were the parents of 9 children, one died as an infant. The family was found in the 1861 and 1871 census at Lancaster.

Thomas Parkin Standen died June 1875 at age 46, leaving his wife pregnant with their last child. Joseph Stephen was born seven months later.

In the 1881 census Mary was a widow (age 51). Seven of her children were living with her. The eldest, James, was evidently away working. Her 2 sons, Thomas and William, were painters, and son John, was a plumber. These boys were probably supporting the family. Agnes (age 20) was a milliner. The mother, Mary never remarried. She died September 1886, at age 57 at which time only one child, James (age 31) was married.

A letter from Leonard John Nuttall May 21, 1885 to son Leonard.. . . "Mrs. Dawson's brother, Parkin, who is now dead promised me that he would let me have all the genealogical records of their family that he could get; but he was very sick at the time. He may have got it together. If you can see William Dawson say this much, he may help you to get it from Parkin's widow or otherwise."

1889 Feb dau Mary Margaret born Lancaster.

JAMES STANDEN (age 31) married January 1884 to Ellen Rigby (age 33) at St. Peter's Catholic Church at Lancaster. By occupation he was a house painter and Ellen a barmaid. They are found in the 1891 census with one child, Mary Margaret (age 2).

jj#2 1890 Oct **THOMAS STANDEN** ae 35 md. **MARY HOLLINGHURST** ae 31 at Lancaster.
Occupation of Thomas: Decorator.

THOMAS STANDEN (age 35) married October 1890 to Mary Hollinghurst (age 31) in St. Peter's Catholic Church at Lancaster. His occupation was given as decorator (which is in the house painting trade).

From the Richard Nuttall diary with Leonard John Nuttall: "Thursday June 4th 1885..After breakfast called on Thomas Standen (a cousin) (L. John and his father spelled this name Standing in their records), 44 North Road, son of Parkin Standen, also became acquainted with his brother, James Standen. According to M. Standen's invitation (Mary Standen, mother of Thomas & William) we called on him at 2 p.m. and proceeded to visit St. Mary's church, one of the oldest in England, also a catholic chapel and around Lancaster Castle, from thence to see his mother where we had dinner."

In the Directory of Lancaster and Area, (published in 1886) Thomas Standen is listed as a painter and decorator living at 44 North Road.

Occupation of William: Master Painter and Hotel Keeper.

1890 Aug son Joseph William born Lancaster.

1892 Jan son Thomas Francis born Lancaster.

1893 Dec son Edward Bernard born Lancaster.

1895 Nov son George Gardner born Lancaster

Family found in 1891 Census at Lancaster.

1900 Sep father, William Standen died ae 43 at Lancaster.

WILLIAM STANDEN (age 31) married Mary Gardner (age 30) August 20, 1889 in St. Peter's Catholic Church at Lancaster. His occupation was a Master House Painter and hotel keeper.

In the 1891 census of Lancaster, William, Mary and their first child, Joseph William, were lodgers living with Mary's sister, Ellen Gardner, who is an innkeeper and single. Three other relatives are living with them also.

Four children were found for William and Mary. William, the father died September, 1900 at age 43. On his death certificate his occupation is hotel keeper. He probably helped run the inn of his sister-in-law.

#5 1890 Oct **JOHN LANGHORN STANDEN** ae 27 md. **JANE HOLLINGHURST** ae 28 at
Lancaster. Occupation of John: Plumber and Glazier.

JOHN LANGHORN STANDEN, son of Thomas Parkin and Mary Standen married October, 1890 (age 27) to Jane Hollinghurst (age 28) in St. Peter's Catholic Church at Lancaster. His occupation was plumber and glazier. The business of the plumber consists in the art of casting and working of lead and using it in buildings, mainly making sheets and pipes of lead.

This couple was found in the 1891 census of Lancaster. Living with them were the three sisters of John: Agnes (age 30), Mary (age 25) and Eliza (age 21). Eliza was a pupil teacher. The occupations of Agnes and Mary were not recorded.

JOHN LANGHORN STANDEN, son of Agnes and Thomas Standen (age 23) married Margaret Leeds (age 26) May 4, 1858 in the Catholic Church at Preston. John's occupation was currier, one who dressed and colored leather after the tanning process. Margaret was a domestic servant at the time of her marriage. Their son, Thomas was born the next year in Lancaster.

They appeared in the 1861 census of Lancaster with their son and Margaret's sister, Ann E. Leeds (age 32), a dressmaker. In the 1871 census was their son (age 11) and a nephew, Richard Swift, son of John's sister, Mary Jane Swift, who was living in Liverpool. In the 1881 and the 1891 censuses John and Margaret were working at the lunatic asylum in Lancaster. They were living in Scotforth, about 2½ miles south of Lancaster.

From the Richard Nuttall diary with Leonard John Nuttall: "Saturday May 16, 1885 we visited the Lancashire asylum where we met father's cousin, John Standen who is an attendant there. We were kindly shown through by him.....leaving the home of the unfortunates we made our way to Williamson park."

1877 Jun father, William Standen, died ae 35 at Lancaster.

WILLIAM STANDEN, son of Agnes and Thomas Standen married May 3, 1865 to Jane Swarbrick of Liverpool. They were married in St. Peter's Catholic Church at Lancaster by his brother, James, who was a Catholic priest. He was the only son to follow his father's occupation of butcher.

The family was found in the 1871 census with 4 of their 5 children. No. 5, Mary was born in 1873.

The father, William, died in June of 1877 at age 35. That same month their son, James, age 9, also died. Four years later in the 1881 census, Jane, a widow, was earning her living by baking bread. She had 3 of her children with her (ages 12, 10, and 7). The eldest, Agnes, who by this time was age 15, was probably working as a domestic servant.

In the 1891 census, Jane still worked as a baker. Her two daughters were Elizabeth, a shop woman now age 27 and Mary, a school teacher now age 17. In August of 1897 daughter, Elizabeth, married Henry Verity in St. Peter's at Lancaster. His occupation: tobacconist.

No. 8 Md. No. 2: 1879 Oct **MARY JANE SWIFT** ae 33 md. **HENRY EDWARDS** ae 22 at West Derby. Occupation of Henry: Butcher.
Family found in 1881 Census at West Derby..

MARY JANE STANDEN, the youngest child of Agnes and Thomas Standen, (age 19) married William Swift (age 22) of Liverpool in St. Peter (Catholic Church) at Lancaster. They were married by Mary Jane's brother, James, a Catholic priest. William's occupation was butcher, and Mary Jane's a book binder. It is possible that Mary Jane may have been living in the Liverpool area where she met William.

Their first child was born at Everton, a village north of Liverpool. The next 5 children were born at West Derby, a village about 2 miles northwest from Liverpool. Mary Jane was only 30 years old when her last child was born. Sometime between 1875 and 1879 her husband, William died.

In October of 1879 Mary Jane (age 33) married Henry Edwards (age 22) in St. Oswald (Catholic Church) at West Derby. Since Henry was a butcher by trade, this may have been a marriage of convenience as Henry could carry on the family butcher business legally.

In the 1881 census at West Derby all six children were listed with Henry Edwards as the head of the family. The eldest daughter (age 14) was a milliner. Also living with them was Mary's sister, Sarah (age 44) and Mary's nephew, James Standen (age 28), son of Thomas Parkin Standen. James' was a butcher probably working with Henry Edwards who was only age 23.
